English for Academic Purposes (EAP) International Program

The EAP International program offered at Algonquin College has **8 levels**. Each level is **8 weeks** in duration. **There are 2 Pre-EAP levels and 6 EAP levels**. Students build the necessary English language skills to operate within professional and college environments through academic reading, writing, listening and speaking courses. Learning activities focus on active participation and critical thinking in academic and workplace contexts through in-class and lab activities.

Level 5 (EAP level 3A) with a B- average is accepted for the English requirement for most Diploma and Certificate programs offered at Algonquin College.

Level 6 (EAP level 3B) with a B average is accepted for most Degree programs, graduate certificate programs and Health related programs at Algonquin.

Tuition fees: \$2,803.00 CAD***. This includes mandatory health insurance and Bus Pass.

***Fees are subject to change without notice.

A **placement test** is required in order to determine your EAP level. The placement test is normally 3 hours long and results are normally provided at the EAP International Orientation. Further written details about the EAP orientation are provided at the EAP placement test. If you have a recent IELTS and/or TOEFL score please bring a copy of your results with you. Your results and placement test results will be used to determine your placement. The average length of studies is 2-4 months for each .5 on the IELTS.

Orientation

Attend the EAP International orientation to learn your EAP placement test results, meet the Coordinator, new friends and learn about health insurance and services provided to International students.



Steps to Register for the EAP International program:

1. Apply to the EAP International program and submit the **\$95 non-refundable application fee payment**. You can submit an on-line application here: <https://xweb.algonquincollege.com/FormIE/index.aspx>
2. If you are not in Canada, indicate how long you intend to study EAP and a letter of acceptance will be sent to you by email within 3 business days. If you are in Canada and you require a letter of acceptance, you must pre-pay one level of the EAP program in order to get a letter of acceptance.
3. Instructions on how to book your placement test will be sent to you after we receive your completed application for the EAP program.
4. Your Algonquin Student Number (a 9 digit number beginning with 040XXXXXX) will be on your letter of acceptance and/or on your payment receipt.
5. Send a copy of your passport, study permit and local address information by email to Sue Hodgins at hodgins@algonquincollege.com once you have the information.
